Principal's Report

Dear Parents/Carers/Kin,

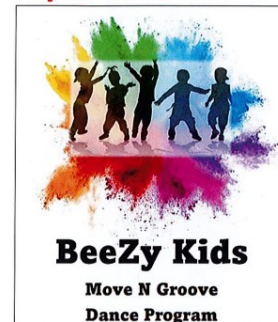

WANDIN YALLOCK OUTSIDE SCHOOL HOURS CARE Special Term 2 Dance Program



During Term 2, on Monday afternoons our OSHC Program will be running a special dance program run by a experienced dance teacher starting from Monday 2nd May. The program will run from 3.45pm-4.45pm and be part of OSHC activities.

Your child can be involved in this even if you do not normally use our OSHC service. You just need to have them enrolled into our service. If your child is a regular attendee on Mondays and they do not wish to participate there will be other activities offered as usual.

The cost of the dance lessons are included in the \$25 after school care fee. If you are eligible for Child Care Subsidies, this could cost you as little as \$5 per week. It also includes afternoon tea before they start the lesson. Normally a 1 hour dance lesson would cost around \$15-\$25 per week.

The students will learn a dance routine to be performed at our end of term school assembly.

If you wish to enrol your child, please see the information below.

As a licensed Child Care provider, we require all guardians accessing our service to complete mandatory registration for their child to attend our care. This registration is a legal requirement for Wandin Yallock's Outside School Hours Care program to accept children into our care and give our staff all the necessary information so we can provide the best care for each child entering our doors.

Learning at WYPS in Term 3

Writing—students will be writing with the purpose of informing the reader, through information reports, news reports or scientific reports.

Inquiry—the topic title in term 3 is Social Justice. Students will be learning about fairness and friendships and celebrating other people's differences.

If you are willing to be part of a roster to help at Breakfast club please pop in and see myself or Helen .

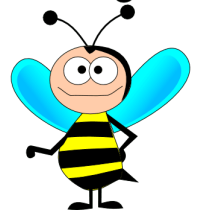
Working Bee

Farm News

National Tree Day

We will be hosting a planting in our Nature Play Forest below the stadium with special guests from Toyota and an AFL football celebrity. Our families are welcome to join our students for the event, please save the date and more details will be announced next term.

Recent celebrations:

Our school has been awarded a B&B Highway education resource package valued over \$2000 and \$500 Bunnings gift voucher through EASL and PlantingSeeds Project. We will be part of the growing B&B Highway (Bed & Breakfasts for Birds, Bees and Biodiversity) which is regenerating the urban environment and connecting schools. Resources and sessions developed by PlantingSeeds Projects, the Department of Education and the CSIRO.

We are the lucky winners of 1 of 6 Ausflora Pacific Colourful Garden Grants to the value of \$500 from The Victorian School Garden Program. This grant will allow us to create a garden that incorporates a range of different coloured flowers and foliage to create a feast for the eyes through the seasons.

We have just purchased 3 new state-of-the-art vegie food cubes from Biofilta which will enhance our student eating area. This project has been funded through our VSGP award money and school community support. Check out their Melbourne based company, helping grow vegies. 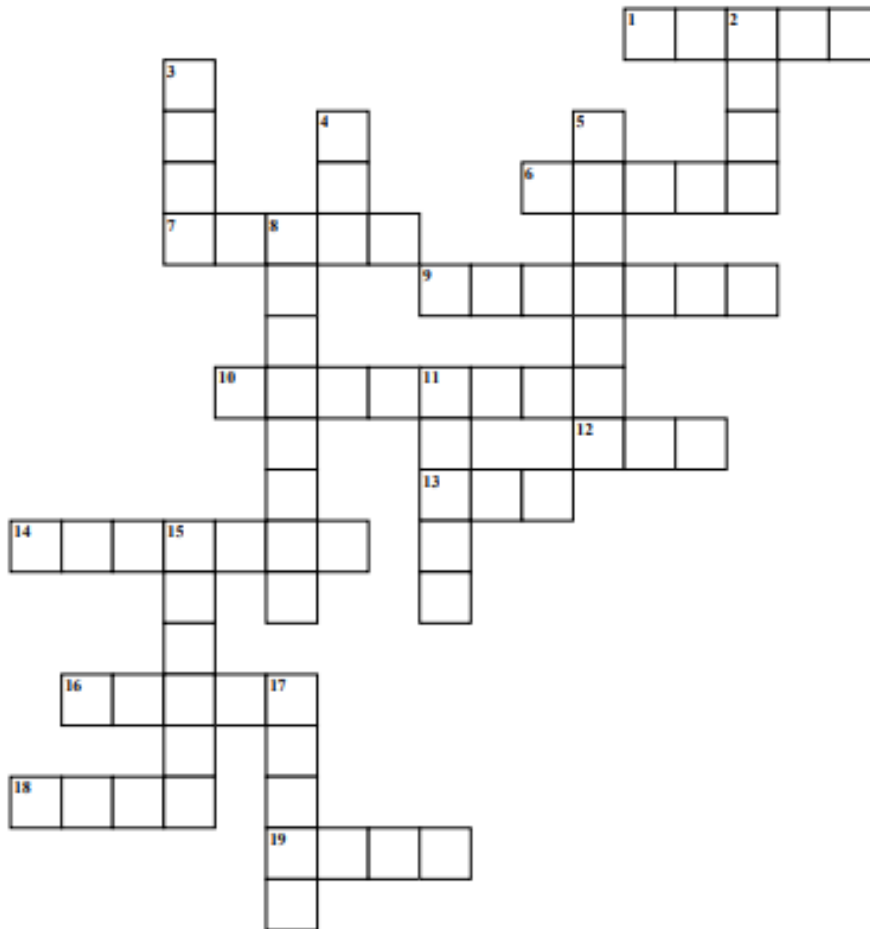

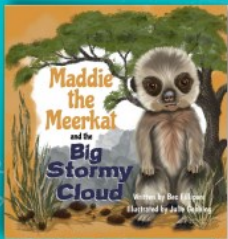
