- 2. How did you do?
- 3. What did you do if you didn't understand?
- 4. How can you improve on your learning?
- 5. What are you most proud of?

The next round of formal parent teacher interviews are next Tuesday, 9th August—bookings via XUNO.

These interviews are a great opportunity for parents to ask any questions or queries about your child's learning. If there is something you are worried about or if you would like to know how you can help your child with their learning at home, please book an interview with your teacher.

Similar to the question above parents could ask teachers:

- 1. What is my child learning?
- 2. How are they doing?
- 3. How do you know how they are doing?
- 4. How can they improve?
- 5. What supports can I provide and can you provide if they are struggling?
